  - (b) Explain the criteria used in the selection of the 27 books of the New Testament. (12 marks)

- 3. (a) Discuss the significance of the call of Levi. (Mark 2:14).
  - (b) Explain the lessons that Christians in Uganda today can learn from the call of Levi. (12 marks)
- 4. To what extent does Mark's Gospel portray Jesus as a divine being?
  (25 marks)
- 5. 'Both John and Mark portray Jesus as the Messiah.' Justify this statement.

  (25 marks)
- 6. 'The Gospels of Mark and John portray Peter as the leader of the twelve disciples.' Discuss. (25 marks)
- 7. (a) Examine the significance of Jesus' healing of the official's son in John's Gospel. (John 4: 46-54). (13 marks)
  - (b) Suggest lessons that leaders can learn from the official. (12 marks)
- 8. "If any one of you is without sin, let him be the first to throw a stone at her." (John 8:7 NIV).
  - (a) Examine the significance of this suggestion by Jesus Christ.

  - (b) In what ways can religious leaders apply this teaching in their ministry? (13 marks)
