To launch the Competitive Entrance Examination to recruit two hundred (200) trainees into Cycle "A" of the National School of Local Administration (NASLA).-

THE MINISTER OF DECENTRALISATION AND LOCAL DEVELOPMENT,

Mindful of the Constitution; Law No. 2019/24 of 24 December 2019 to institute the General Mindful of Code of Regional and Local Authorities: Decree No. 2011/408 of 9 December 2011 to organize the Mindful of Government, as amended and supplemented by Decree No. 2018/190 of 2 March 2018; Decree No. 2018/191 of 2 March 2018 to reorganize the Mindful of Government: Decree No. 2018/449 of 1 August 2018 to organize the Ministry of Mindful of Decentralization and Local Development; Decree No. 2020/111 of 2 March 2020 to lay down the Mindful of establishment and organization of the National School of Local Administration (NASLA); Decree No. 2021/742 of 28 December 2021 to institute the Mindful of standard organization of the regional administration; Order No. 136/A/MINATD/DCTD of 24 August 2009, to give effect Mindful of to the standard council employment tables,

HEREBY ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Article 1.-</u> (1) A Competitive Entrance Examination to recruit two hundred (200) trainees into Cycle "A" of NASLA – Buea is open for the 2022/2023 Academic Year.

(2) The available places are distributed as follows:

- (3) The related programme is appended to this order.
- (4) Candidates shall choose their field of study when submitting their application files.
- Article 2.- The Entrance examination is open to all Cameroonians irrespective of their sex and language (French and English) who fulfil the following conditions:

(a) For External Candidates:

- be a holder of a Bachelor's Degree from a Higher Education institution in Cameroon including Professional Bachelor's Degrees in Law, Economics, Social Sciences and in Management or an equivalent Diploma issued by a foreign university and recognized as equivalent by the Minister of Higher Education;
- be at least seventeen (17) years old and not more than forty-two (42) years old as from 1 January 2022 (born between 1 January 1980 and 1 January 2005);
- be physically fit and in good health to effectively carry out the duties of Senior Executive of Local Administration;
- enjoys his/her civic rights;
- not have been condemned for offences incompatible with the exercise of the duties of Senior Executive of Local Administration as established by a certificate of non-conviction.

(b) For Internal Candidates:

- be a Holder of the CEFAM Cycle I Diploma and have at least five (5) years of professional experience;
- be at most forty-five (45) years old as of 1 January 2022;
- be authorised by the employer to sit for the Entrance Examination.

<u>Article 3.-</u> State employees governed by the labour code and civil servants shall not be eligible for this Entrance Examination.

Article 4.- (1) Registration forms can be downloaded from the NASLA website at www.nasla.cm.

- (2) Registration fees which amount to CFA thirty thousand (30 000) francs for external candidates and CFA fifty thousand (50 000) francs for internal candidates are payable into NASLA BICEC Bank Account No. 0868 544 2000 25 or No. 00313000010 at Union Bank of Cameroon PLC, abbreviated "UBC".
- (3) Candidates' complete application files can be submitted, against a receipt at NASLA or at the Regional Delegations of the Ministry of Decentralisation and Local Development, with the exception of the South-West Regional Delegation.
- (4) Complete application files must reach the above-mentioned locations not later than 3.30 p.m. on Friday, 14 October 2022.
 - (5) The application file shall comprise the following:
 - A registration form bearing one thousand (1,000) francs stamp duly filled and signed by the candidate;
 - Two (02) passport size 4x4 photographs;
 - A receipt of payment of the registration fees issued by a competent official of BICEC or UBC;
 - A certified true copy of the required certificate;
 - An attestation of presentation of original of the required certificate signed by the Governor, the S.D.O or the D.O;
 - An attestation of presentation of original of the Baccalaureate or GCE "A"
 Level or any other Certificate having enabled admission into a higher institution of learning, signed by the Governor, S.D.O or the D.O;
 - A certificate of non-conviction issued by a competent judicial authority dating not more than three (3) months on the date of submission;
 - A certified true copy of Birth Certificate, hand-filled or typed, signed by a competent authority;
 - A medical certificate dating not more than three (3) months on the day of submission, issued by a public sector Medical Doctor;
 - An envelope bearing CFA one thousand (1000) francs (postage stamp) and the candidate's address;
 - For internal candidates, include an authorisation to sit for the Entrance Examination, issued by the employer.
- <u>Article 5.-</u> (1) Any incomplete file, late file, file containing fake or falsified documents, or documents signed at a police station shall be rejected.
- (2) The lists of candidates authorised to compete shall be published on the Notice Board in the NASLA Campus, and at the MINDDEVEL Regional Delegations on Wednesday 9 November 2022. The publication of these lists shall serve as an invitation to sit for the entrance examination.

- (3) Receipts for applications for issue of national identity cards that are less than three (3) months old on the closing date for registration for the entrance exams shall be rejected.
- (4) Any fraud observed before, during, or after the entrance exams shall be sanctioned in accordance with the laws and regulations in force.
- <u>Article 6.-</u> (1) The written part of the examination shall take place in the following examination centres: Buea, Garoua and Yaounde.
- (2) The candidate shall choose his/her examination centre when registering on line on the website www.nasla.cm.
- (3) The written part of the examination shall take place according to following dates and hours:

<u>Article 8.-</u> The final results of successful candidates shall be published by an order of the Minister of Decentralisation and Local Development.

<u>Article 9.-</u> Foreign candidates may be admitted on the basis of specifications in accordance with the procedures laid down by a decision of the Minister of Decentralisation and Local Development.
